

Plastipak Iberia participates in project MIPLASCOE with a group of companies with the objective to develop new bioplastics from the waste of the orange juice industry for the orange juice packaging and for use in the railway industry.

This waste comes from our Spanish customer J. Garcia Carrion and goes through different companies until it is developed into a biopolyester that Plastipak can inject and blow to produce a bottle.

The MIPLASCOE project has been co-financed by the Center for the Development of Industrial Technology (CDTI) and the European Regional Development Fund (FEDER) through the 2016 Innterconecta Program, where the objective is to promote the generation of innovative capacities through experimental development projects.

MIPLASCOE project has been developed along Andalucía, Murcia, Toledo and Valencia, from July 2016 to March 2019 and the investment has been 2.228.555,00€ approximately.
